

Phantom Blade Zero Release Date Set to Be Revealed at The Game Awards 2025

S-GAME Confirms World Premiere Date Reveal for the Highly Anticipated Wuxia Action RPG

Fans of *Phantom Blade Zero* finally have confirmation: the long-awaited release date for S-GAME's Wuxia-style action RPG will be officially announced during **The Game Awards 2025**. This highly anticipated reveal has been teased for months, but players now know for certain that the global showcase in December will host the world premiere announcement.

The reveal follows an earlier promise from director **Soulframe Liang**, who stated during the Future Games Show @ Gamescom that the launch date would be announced before the end of 2025. Players take on the role of an elite assassin navigating a bleak and dangerous world while hunting the mysterious figure responsible for killing the patriarch of **The Order**, a powerful organization central to the game's plot.

The title stands out for its fast-paced, choreography-driven combat that combines elements of **Soulslike difficulty**, **action-RPG progression**, and classic martial arts aesthetics. Early demos have shown fluid movement, high-speed attacks, weapon variety, and a cinematic presentation reminiscent of kung-fu epics.

Gameplay impressions from hands-on previews earlier this year praised the game's:

- **Elegant combo systems and counter-based mechanics**
- **Grim Wuxia worldbuilding**

- **Striking art direction blending fantasy and historical Chinese influences**
- **Fast, responsive controls despite the game's challenging nature**

With a release date reveal now locked in for The Game Awards 2025, excitement around the title has surged yet again.
